Monica Piga Wallace is a faculty member at SUNY Buffalo Law School, where she teaches legal analysis, research and writing and the Post-Incarceration Reentry Practicum. The Post-Incarceration Reentry Practicum is a collaboration among SUNY Buffalo Law School, the Federal Reentry Court for the Western District of New York, and Legal Aid of Buffalo. Students in the Practicum engage in service learning by helping to resolve civil legal issues encountered by newly released federal offenders. Students in the Practicum also learn about mass incarceration and the collateral consequences to sentencing.

Before joining SUNY Buffalo Law School, Professor Wallace served as a confidential law clerk to Hon. Richard J. Arcara, United States District Court Judge for the Western District of New York, and as a law clerk to the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. Her expertise includes legal writing and analysis, legal research, federal litigation, civil procedure, criminal procedure, and federal sentencing issues. Professor Wallace began her legal career at the Buffalo law firm of Phillips Lytle LLP, where she practiced law in the commercial litigation and commercial lending departments.

Professor Wallace received her J.D., *cum laude*, from SUNY Buffalo Law School, and her B.A. in Political Science, with high honors, from SUNY Binghamton. She is an active member of the Women's Bar Association for the State of New York, where she currently serves as a local director and Chair of the Judiciary Committee.
